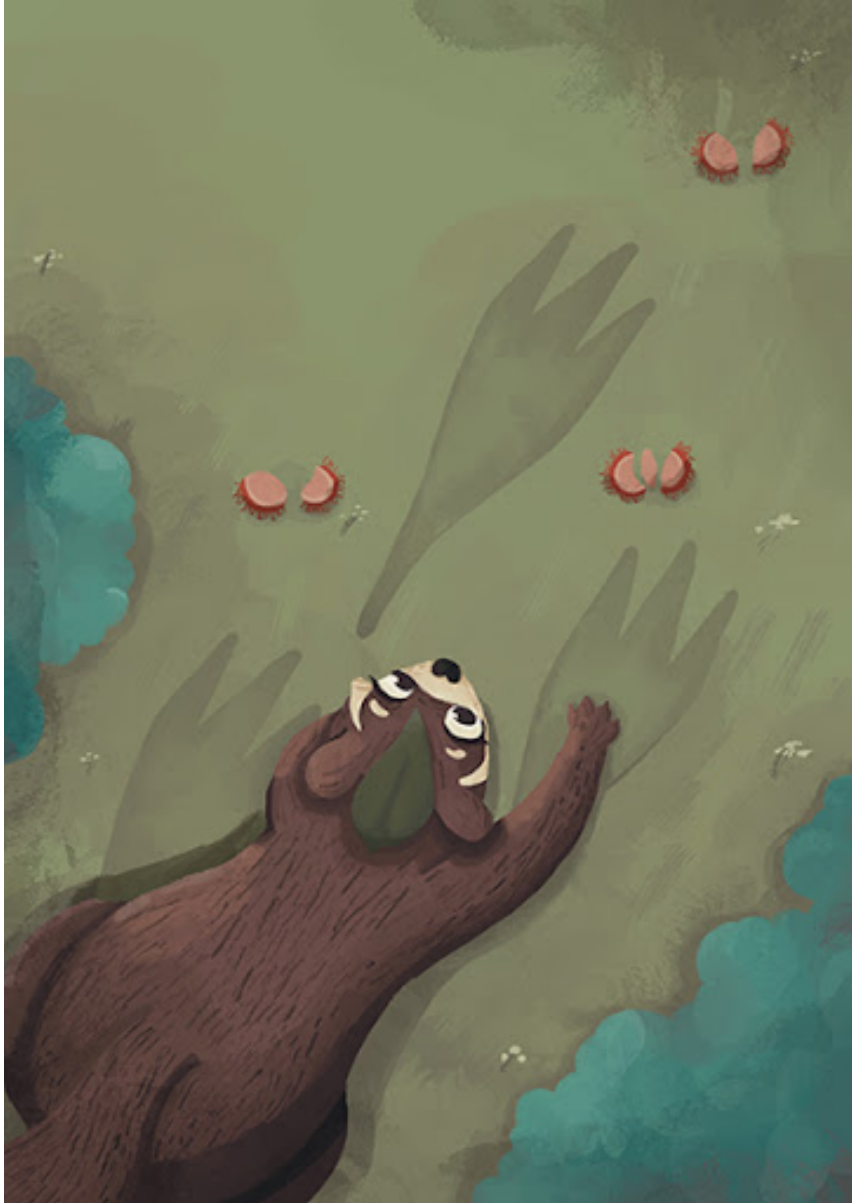


Jela wants to eat some rambutan.
